There is growing evidence that demonstrates the potential of mobile communications to improve healthcare services. A vast number of applications already exist for different health conditions, but the majority offer similar functions and fail to include a comprehensive motivational framework to ensure certain engagement and mid-long term adherence to the service. Furthermore, chronic conditions require a great participation, willingness and self-management abilities from patients. Thus, the "spirit of MI" is more close to a patient empowerment approach. There are not too many mobile applications developed and implemented with a motivational framework from the very initial phases of service design. The PRECIOUS service (PREventive Care Infrastructure based On Ubiquitous Sensing) is a project funded by European Union and is intended to overcome such limitation. It combines a multidisciplinary scientific corpus of knowledge, nurtured from information and technology communication, engineering, psychology sciences and MI experts. The presentation will provide to the audience an overview about how MI can be adapted to build a mHealth motivational system to enhance engagement among users with chronic health conditions.
